**Bryan Henare, coach of the Tūhoe 2016 Men's team had this to say to his kaitākaro...**  
*Good leadership does not come from who is the better player, good leadership comes from working together as a team to achieve a certain goal and we all showed that as a team at the Māori Nationals. We didnt get the result we wanted, however we can all hold our heads up high because we left everything on the field. I wasnt more prouder then to see men walk off the field absolutely shattered, then strap up and get out there and do it over and over again.*
