



Through Hapū, Tribal and Te Kāhui Pakeke hui, succession has been noted as a priority of Te Waimana Hapū & Whārua development. In July 2016, Te Waimana Kaaku Trust was granted funding to draft a strategy for Leadership and Succession for Te Waimana Kaaku. As part of this mahi, Rangatahi have been engaged to project plan, run workshops and carry out interviews with ngā kanohi kitea ō Te Waimana Kaaku Hapū. To date, they have shared this kaupapa with Te Kāhui Pakeke, Te Waimana Kaaku Tribal hui at Tanatana and through an information workshop held last night.

Leadership is not about titles, positions, or flow charts. It is about one life influencing another.

Tātau Katoa Ka Toa Tātau

Succession is **fostering** a culture of growing talent from within, by providing the support to better equip atu, ki te ako i ēnei ō ngā kaupapa them for the challenges of today and hira, tukuna mai to ingoa, me tō readiness for tomorrow.

Earlier this year, Hōri Hillman and a groups of keen pakeke opened a forum for Whaikorero wānanga. An awesome start to succession planning mō ngā tunga o mua.

In 2017, it is planned to include Karanga into those wānanga.

Te Ahi Kaa Roa Community Maara Kai


Foster the pathway of knowledge to strength, independence and growth for future generations.



In conjunction with GNS and Victoria University, **Te Uru Taumatua** will undertake a joint project to search for dinosaur fossils within **Te Urewera**. This follows a discovery and subsequent research beginning near the southern boundary of **Te Urewera** 30 years ago.

Base camp and field parties will be established to do this mahi. It is anticipated that a Pakeke, Rangatahi and other interested people from **Te Waimana** will participate. Team sizes to be advised.
